

Safeguarding adults training for trainers course

Audience - The course is designed for those who will be delivering training to staff involved in supporting adults.

Learning outcomes - At the end of the course participants will:

- Understand that participants have different ways of learning
- Be able to adapt the training material to meet different participants needs
- Deliver training to cover the following areas:
 - Be aware of legislation relevant to safeguarding,
 - Explore what is abuse including signs and symptoms,
 - Be familiar with the procedures for reporting abuse,
 - Discuss good practice procedures if someone discloses abuse,
 - Explore factors that may lead to abusive situations and or poor practice,
 - Know how deal with disclosures, preserve evidence and how to record incidents according to policy requirements.

Entry requirements - The course is aimed at those who already have training experience, such as PTLLS, CTLLS, DTLLS, Cert Ed, Level 3 Award in Education and Training etc.

It is also expected that the participant have completed training in:

- Safeguarding adults basic awareness
- Mental Capacity Act
- Deprivation of Liberty Safeguards

Cost - £150 this will include:

- Full day training
- Training materials
- DVD and facilitators guide to support the effective use of the DVD
- Copy of the SET guidelines
- Assessment of knowledge questionnaires
- Observation of training in own setting with feedback report
- Certificate (following observation).
